

Second Circular *XI International Ichnofabric Workshop*



Presentation

The 11th IIW will be held in the MUJA (Museo del Jurásico de Asturias; Jurassic Museum of Asturias <http://www.museojurasicoasturias.com>), located in the village of Colunga (Asturias, N Spain), from 1 to 5th, July, 2011. Convenors will be Prof. Francisco J. Rodríguez-Tovar (University of Granada) and Dr. José Carlos García-Ramos (Scientific Director of MUJA and University of Oviedo). The Jurassic Museum of Asturias is located in a privileged area of the Asturian coast in a singular building in the shape of a three-toed dinosaur footprint which houses one of the most complete and didactic exhibitions on this kind of animals in Spain. In the Museum a permanent exhibition area has been designed as a walk along the natural history of our planet from before the Mesozoic until the present day in a chronological order so that, through its 2000 square meters, the visitor comes to a better understanding of the Mesozoic and of the life of the dinosaurs. Besides the Permanent Exhibition Area the building of the museum does also have other facilities to further implement the services and cultural offer of the museum; these areas include the Temporary Exhibitions Area, the Auditorium, Workshop/meeting-room and Rest Area.

Schedule

June 30, 2011. Arrive to Colunga, Asturias, N Spain.

July 1-3, 2011. Scientific sessions and intra-meeting field trip. Visit to Museum ichnofossil collections.

July 4-5, 2011. Post-meeting field trips.

July 6, 2011. Return to home.

Presentations and extended abstracts

Contributions to every ichnofabric topic are welcome. Invited talks, oral and poster presentation are planned. The authors must indicate their preferred format for presentation (oral or poster); however, the final decision belongs to the Organizing Committee, based on the number of submitted abstracts.

Oral presentations: There will be 15 minutes (less than 10 minutes to allow at least 5 minutes for discussion). Lecture rooms will be equipped with computer and projector (only PowerPoint presentations). However, according to the definitive number of oral and posters presentations, the available time could be slightly modified.

Posters presentations: Dimension will be 140 cm **wide** and 110 cm **high**, maximum. Temporary Exhibitions Area will be available for poster presentation. Posters will be displayed the first day (1st, July) and remove the last day (3rd, July) of the scientific

sessions. Material (drawing pin) for mounting the poster on the boards will be provided in the poster's room. According to the schedule, a panel discussion session will be programmed. During this session, authors will have 5 minutes to explain their poster and then 5 minutes for discussion.

Field trips

July 2. Field trip A (intra-meeting field trip).

El Tranqueru sea cliffs, close to Candás (picnic). Ichnofabrics, sedimentary facies, discontinuity surfaces and sequence stratigraphy in Middle Devonian siliciclastic coastal and shelf deposits.



Including a touristic visit to Naranco Pre Romanesque Monuments (World Heritage Monument, UNESCO 1985), close to Oviedo (capital of Asturias) and Villaviciosa.



July 4-5, 2011. Post-Workshop field trips.

July 4: Field trip B.

Vega Beach (picnic) next to Ribadesella. Ichnofabrics from the Lower Jurassic (Sinemurian and Pliensbachian) marl-limestone rhythmites.



Including touristic visit to Tito Bustillo Cave (World Heritage Monument, UNESCO 2008). The cave paintings of Magdalenian age are among the main Paleolithic parietal art sites of the World. An extensive karstic complex excavated in Carboniferous limestones.

July 5: Field trip C.

Stop 1. Villar Sea cliffs, near Villaviciosa. Softground, firmground and hardground ichnofabrics of the Upper Sinemurian (Lower Jurassic) successions (shallow water nodular limestone).



Stop 2. Tazones lighthouse seacliffs (picnic), close to Villaviciosa. Dinosaur tracks, invertebrate trace fossils and ichnofabrics in fluvial-dominated deltaic successions (Kimmeridgian, Upper Jurassic).
